Inspection Details:

On 11 March 2026 at 1015hrs, I, Safety Officer Brad Koprowsky, arrived at Kluane Drilling's maintenance shop, located at 27 Macdonald Road in Whitehorse. Upon arrival I met with Irving Salas, Safety Officer for Kluane Drilling. I informed him that I was there to conduct a Workplace Health and Safety inspection of the location. We toured the following locations:

- Warehouse
- Welding shop
- Heavy duty shop
- Yard

Warehouse

- Emergency exits were clear and unobstructed.
- Fire extinguishers were unobstructed and up to date with monthly inspections.
- Safe storage practices were being conducted effectively, with lighter objects store on the top shelf and heavier items stored on the bottom.
- Rolling ladders to access the upper shelves were available and had capacity ratings posted on them.

*** Welding shop***

- I observed two drill presses with no guarding around the rotating parts.
- Fume hoods and portable exhaust hoses were available and in use at the time of the inspection.
- Fire extinguishers were unobstructed and up to date with monthly inspections.
- Emergency exits were clear and unobstructed.
- Flashback arrestors were present on welding gas tanks.
- First aid kit and eyewash were readily available.

Heavy Duty Shop

- Effective guarding was in place for the hydraulic press.
- Lockout procedures and policies were in place for working on equipment.
- Exhaust extractor was available to use for engine use inside.
- There was a drill press with no guarding. When I mentioned this would need a guard, Irving informed me the drill was out of service. I mentioned that the drill should be tagged out or removed to avoid accidental usage.
- First aid kit and eyewash were readily available. One of the three eye wash bottles was expired and was removed from service during the inspection.
- Electrical panels were accessible.

Yard

- I observed mobile equipment running in the yard. I asked to see the pre-operation inspections and Irving informed me it was done digitally with a QR code. I had Irving show me the digital entries of the pre-operation inspections and noticed the last entry was on 25 February 2026. I mentioned to Irving that the mobile equipment needs to be inspected prior to use.
- I observed a fire extinguisher on mobile equipment #511 (zoom boom) that was missing monthly inspections. Irving inspected the extinguisher during the inspection.
- I observed two storage containers built to securely store compressed gas cylinders. The cylinders stored in both containers were Oxygen and Acetylene together.
- Snow removal around emergency exits was being conducted effectively.
